## Land Acknowledgment Policy

PlayGround-NY will offer a land acknowledgment prior to all public programs, inhouse developmental activities, as well as board, staff and committee meetings. In addition, PlayGround-NY will publish the land acknowledgment on its website and post it in its physical spaces.

## Land Acknowledgment Statement

PlayGround acknowledges that we are on the unceded ancestral homeland of the Munsee (MUHN-see) Lenape (Ləh-NAH-pee), the original inhabitants of Manhattan. As the past and present Indigenous stewards of this land and in accordance with their traditions, the Munsee Lanape have never ceded, lost, nor forgotten their responsibilities as the caretakers of this place, as well as for all peoples who reside in their traditional territory. We recognize the historic injustice of the forcible removal of the Lenape people from their ancestral lands, and that we benefit from living and working on their traditional homeland. We wish to pay our respects by acknowledging the Ancestors, Elders and Relatives of the Lenape Communities and by affirming their sovereign rights as First Peoples. We honor the storytellers of the Munsee Lenape and are grateful for our ability to share and uplift Indigenous stories and those of other historically marginalized communities.

In working with artists from all over the country, PlayGround-NY asks that each artist representing a different geographical space respectfully acknowledge the legacy of the land they inhabit.
